- An ambitious agreement that reflects the long-term goal to limit global warming to <math><2^{\circ}\text{C}</math> and sets the right conditions to achieve it
- Comparable and coordinated efforts to create a level-playing field and a competitive environment
- A progressively coordinated use of carbon pricing mechanisms

Our commitments

- To remain the most carbon efficient international cement producer: by 2030, reduce CO₂ emissions per tonne cement by 40% compared to 1990
- Contribute to a sustainable construction value chain: by 2030, avoid every year the emission of 10 million tonnes of CO₂ during the lifecycle of sold products

Our ambition

- The global climate challenge requires a collaborative response that goes beyond our ambitious efforts in own operations
- Our approach is to generate, monitor and report GHG savings right through to the use of our solutions through their life cycle
- We are committed to reducing CO₂ emissions across the entire construction value chain
